MONTH OF AUGUST 2012**

The mission of the Town of Aurora Senior Center is to help older adults remain healthy and active through participation in recreational pursuits and to provide leadership and advocacy to ensure the availability of leisure and recreational opportunities for seniors.

ADMINISTRATIVE:

We held our 19th annual Open House & Program Registration on Sept. 10th. Our instructors are available to answer questions and sign new members. Each year we try to add new programs and offer suggestion sheets for our seniors to fill out for the upcoming year. One of our major focuses is health & wellness with speakers and classes.
