

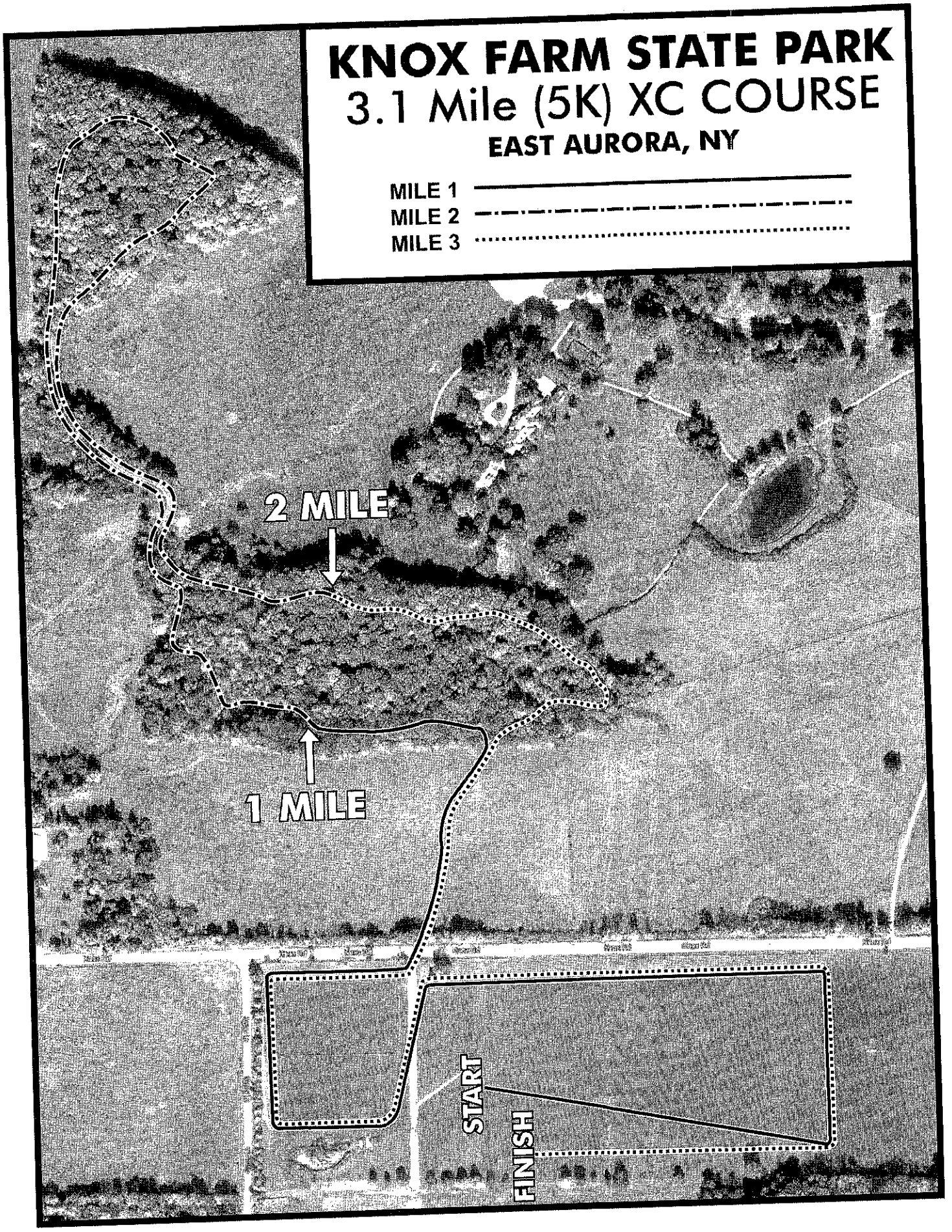

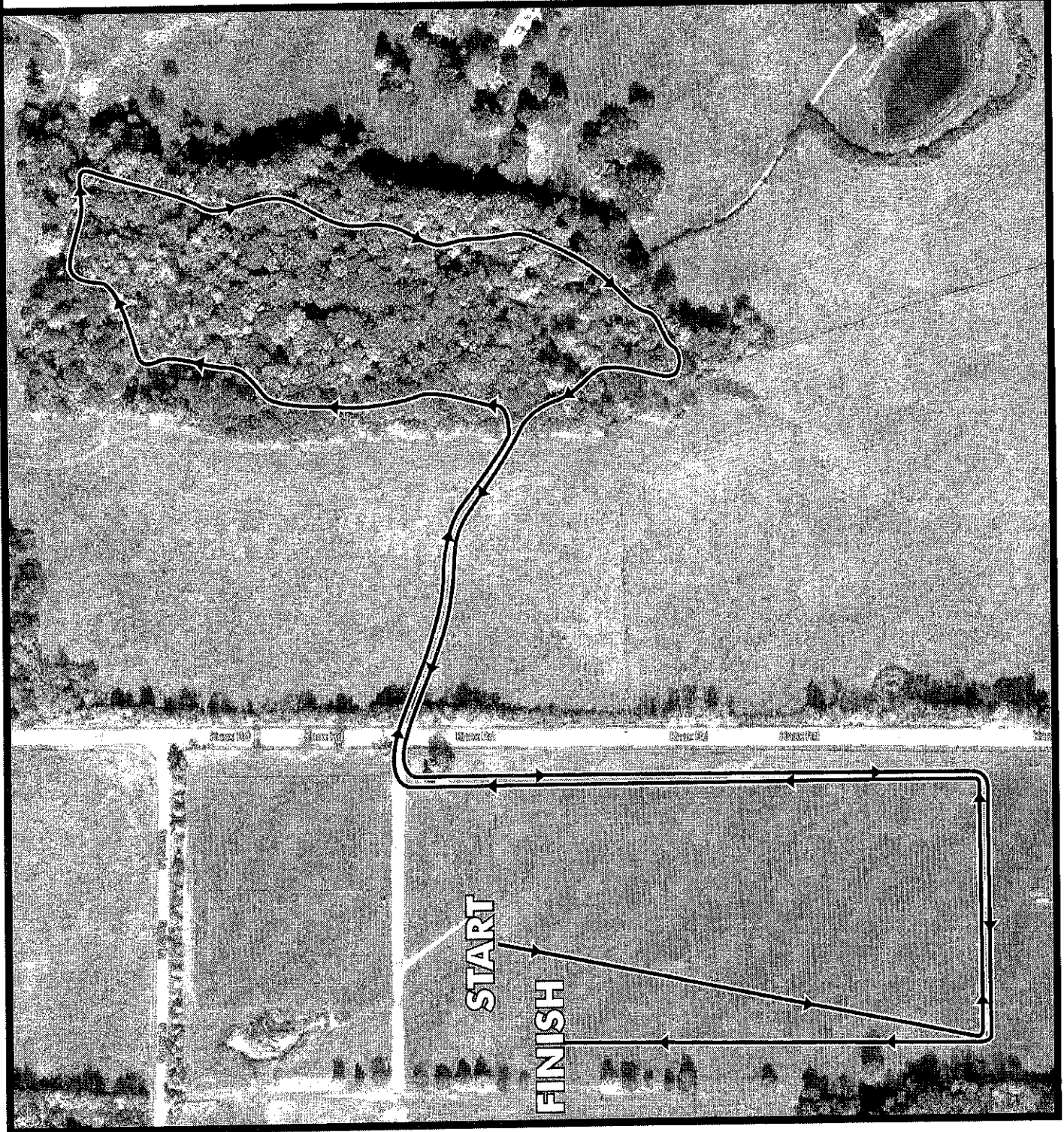

Re: Monthly Report – September 2016

General Information

- New Public Safety Dispatchers Denz and Tackentien's training is progressing well and both are expected to be working alone sometime in October.
- While receiving an increase in complaints regarding traffic, in both the village and town, I have developed a new avenue within the department to post recent complaints, having them more visible for patrol to see and react to. With the new postings of complaints, the idea that when man power and call volume allow, the Officers will have a better grasp of where traffic complaints are being generated and where to focus their attention.
- On September 24th Ed and Yvonne Evilsizor held Coffee, Cops, K-9 and Community at their business, Taste, in support of the Police Department. The event was attended by over 200 people, numerous children were finger printed, Lt. Waldron and Clip did demos and coffee, milk and cookies were enjoyed by all.
- Training:
 - Seven officers were recertified in CPR/AED training and received the annual blood borne pathogens training; the rest of the department will have this training in October.
 - Lt Waldron attended Blue Courage training, which teaches officers how to deal with issues that Law Enforcement encounters through a career. Lt Waldron is a training instructor and will be able to pass this training onto the rest of the department.
 - Several department personnel attended work place violence training and we will be looking into online yearly training for the future.
 - I attend the New York State Intelligence Conference, put on by NYS Intelligence Center. The training was over two days and consisted of

intelligence gathered from several sources, what tools are available to local departments and several individuals spoke on different topics relating to terrorism and other issues Law Enforcement deals with.

- In addition to Village Board, Town Board and Staff meetings I also attended the following:
 - Law Enforcement Foundation of WNY – Distinguished Speakers Forum – Miami Beach Police Chief Daniel Oates spoke of his time as Chief of Aurora Colorado police department, specifically the movie theater shooting
 - Erie County Police Chiefs monthly meeting
 - NYS Intelligence Conference (2 days) – Geneva NY
 - Transported the Datamaster and radar units to DCJS in Albany for annual certification
 - 1 Pistol permit interview

Special Events

Taste of East Aurora – Some early day rain did not prevent the event from being another success. Large crowds filled Main St and no issues were found.
