TOWN BOARD WORK SESSION
October 26, 2020

The following members of the Aurora Town Board met on Monday, October 26, 2020 at 6:45 p.m. in the Town Hall Auditorium, 300 Gleed Avenue, East Aurora, NY, for the purpose of holding a work session:

Deputy Supervisor Snyder opened the session at 6:45 p.m. with the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and noted the regular meeting would begin immediately after the work session.

1) Local Law re: Cyber Security:

The Town Board discussed a proposed Local Law (Intro 2-2020) that would satisfy the requirement of Section 208 of the State Technology Law to establish a notification policy for cyber security breach. Councilwoman Friess asked if there is a set time period to notify individuals in the event of a compromise of an individual's private information. Deputy Supervisor Snyder stated there is no set time, but the Local Law states it will be done in the most expedient time possible and without unreasonable delay.

2) Aurora Municipal Center – Change Order:

Deputy Supervisor Snyder stated that a fall protection guardrail is needed on the roof of the Aurora Municipal Center at RTU #1. Change Order #35 from Telco is to provide and install the guardrail at a cost of \$3,045.00. Councilwoman Friess noted that safety comes first and this needs to be done.

3) Community Pool – emergency repair:

After receiving a large water bill for Community Pool, it was determined that there was a leak in an underground pipe. Numarco, Inc., performed a leak investigation and repaired the broken pipe at a cost of \$4,308.07. The project included cutting through the concrete pool deck, excavating, repairing the broken pipe and patching the concrete deck.

4) Whaley Bridge project – Change order:

At the June 8, 2020 work session, Highway Superintendent Gunner informed the Board that a stream flow study needed to be done for the Whaley Bridge project since the area is in a FEMA flood plain and that Foit Albert would be doing the study. Mr. Gunner explained that the study was expanded when the NYSDEC said that it needed to include the area from the North Grove Street bridge over Tannery Brook eastward to Church Street, not just the Whaley area. This was a time and material study. The final cost was \$21,000.00
