A meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Aurora took place on Monday, March 11, 2024, beginning at 7:52 p.m., immediately following the work session. The Board met in-person at the Aurora Municipal Center, 575 Oakwood Avenue, East Aurora, New York. The meeting was streamed via Zoom and YouTube.

Supervisor Snyder opened the regular meeting at 7:52 p.m. following the work session.

The first item on the agenda was a Public Hearing on the site plan for a Bed and Breakfast (BnB) establishment in the Town.

At 7:52 p.m. Supervisor Snyder opened the Public Hearing for the site plan for the BnB at 1514 Mill Road and asked if anyone wished to comment.

Steve Oubre, property owner, stated that BnB is part of their income and it brings people into the area. Mr. Oubre noted that they are in residence and the bedrooms used for this venture are in the residence.

Hearing no one else, the Supervisor closed the hearing at 7:54 p.m.

Councilman McCann moved to approve the minutes of the February 26, 2024 work session and meeting. Councilman Wochensky seconded the motion. Upon a vote being taken: ayes – five noes – none minutes aprvd

The Board was asked if the request for a temporary use permit for KFSP for a race to benefit the American Cancer Society was on the agenda as she thought it would be. The response was, no, the Board had not received the application yet.

Rod Simeone, Byeberry Court, asked if closing the Town office for the whole day for the eclipse was necessary and that the Town should check with the Village of East Aurora to see what they have planned.

Cheryl (Punky) Schenne, Colden, NY, stated that her father, Ron Schenne, built the Veterans Park in West Falls and she is requesting that the Board consider renaming the park to Ronald A. Schenne Veterans Memorial Park. Councilman Granville noted that other people have talked about renaming the park after Ron. Supervisor Snyder stated that the Board will consider the request.
