I would at this time like to request approval from the Aurora Town Board to engage the services of GDH Engineering to assist in the review of the Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) for the Aurora Mills Subdivision. 

1. Need to put \$ into diamond dirt. The major diamond needs a good 2 inches of diamond dirt, which is estimated at \$7500. The other diamonds are also in need, but we need to do at least 1-2 a year to maintain them. Who is going to do that (Town or Baseball)?
2. What is included in the 'rental' of the ball diamonds by the non-profit baseball league? Cost?
3. Home runs are going out into the parking lot as there is no fencing. A 4 ft or 6 ft fence is needed. Town or Baseball? Baseball would need permission to do this on Town property.
4. Permanent Rest Rooms
5. Insurance - they are procuring Board of Directors insurance. What insurance will Town have on the property? Need to let them know so possibly they could be secondary insurance for players.
6. Warren Park - ball field needs work, might need in future for Jr/Sr diamond.
7. Equipment transfer - Town owned equipment needs to be surplussed and donated to/sold to the new not-for-profit baseball league. Something like the Town did with the gym equipment at the high school.
8. For next season, registration will be done by the newly formed baseball/softball league and checks will be made out to them. Fundraising will be occurring as well.
