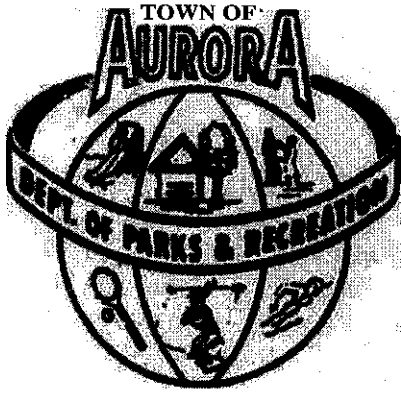

ADMINISTRATIVE:

Reports:

- We now have 8,281 members registered in the recreation system
- We had 318 individual program registrations in the month of January
- We generated \$14,020 in January in sales
- Credit card purchases totaled 61% (94% on-line, 6% office)

Plans for winterfest, spring programs and summer programs are well underway. Winterfest is once again scheduled for the whole week that kids are off school, February 14-23. The week features a large variety of activities for every age and ability that are not weather dependent. The Advertiser has again agreed to publish a winter guide at no cost to the town, which will be out February 6. Elaine has done an excellent job of adding more activities to the schedule, and businesses are now participating in very creative ways.

Registration for baseball and softball began late in January due to weather related school closings. Fliers went out to school one week later than usual, so the deadline to register was extended. The Baseball Commission met on January 22 and discussed the need to be a more independent organization in two years. Councilwoman Sue Friess spoke on behalf of the Town Board and laid out a timeline and milestones. The Commission will review new By-Laws at its next meeting to begin the process.

MONTH OF JANUARY 2014**

The mission of the Town of Aurora Senior Center is to help older adults remain healthy and active through participation in recreational pursuits and to provide leadership and advocacy to ensure the availability of leisure and recreational opportunities for seniors.

ADMINISTRATIVE:

On January 28th I attended our quarterly director's meeting at the Amherst Senior Center. Our discussion centered on how the centers are the emergency sites for their towns and what we do to prepare should a situation arise. We also had a speaker from Liberty Cab to talk about the wheelchair vehicles in his fleet and the grant he recently received to purchase 5 additional cars. This allows the seniors other options when needing a wheelchair accessible vehicle to transport to appointments. The cost is substantially lower than a traditional wheelchair vans and family members may ride along.
